We've been doing our show for almost four years, and it's amazing that there's that much information about it. I mean, I've forgotten stuff. I've seen the Conan Purity Test, and Andy Richter and I were having a hard time answering some of the questions, like 'What did Conan say in the sketch when Andy

is shot out of a cannon?""


